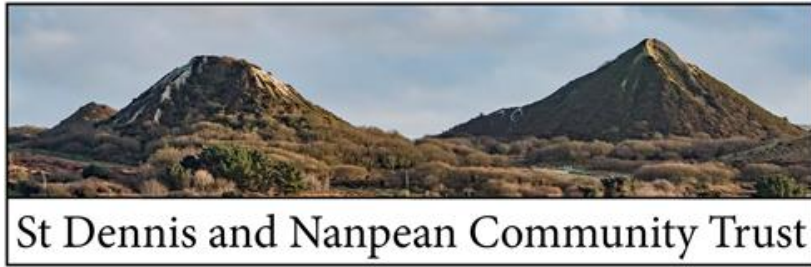

Recent Grants

ST DENNIS OVER 70'S CHRISTMAS LUNCH COMMITTEE: Received funding to host a Christmas Lunch for 40 people in the village! This special event will give residents the opportunity to come together, reconnect with friends, and enjoy some festive cheer. Christmas can be a lonely time for many, so hopefully this gathering will be something for everyone to look forward to.

ST DENNIS FOOTBALL CLUB: Awarded a grant for fencing. This will enable the construction of a secure and durable perimeter fence around the football pitch. This new fencing will be built to Football Association (FA) standards, ensuring appropriate pitch access control, improved crowd management, and enhanced safety for players, spectators, and officials. In addition to supporting Health and Safety regulations, the fence will help reduce the risks associated with unauthorized access and potential accidents. Importantly, this upgrade will also support compliance with public liability requirements, helping to minimize the chance of damage or injury and ensuring continued insurance coverage. 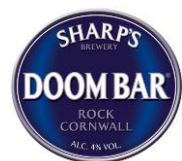

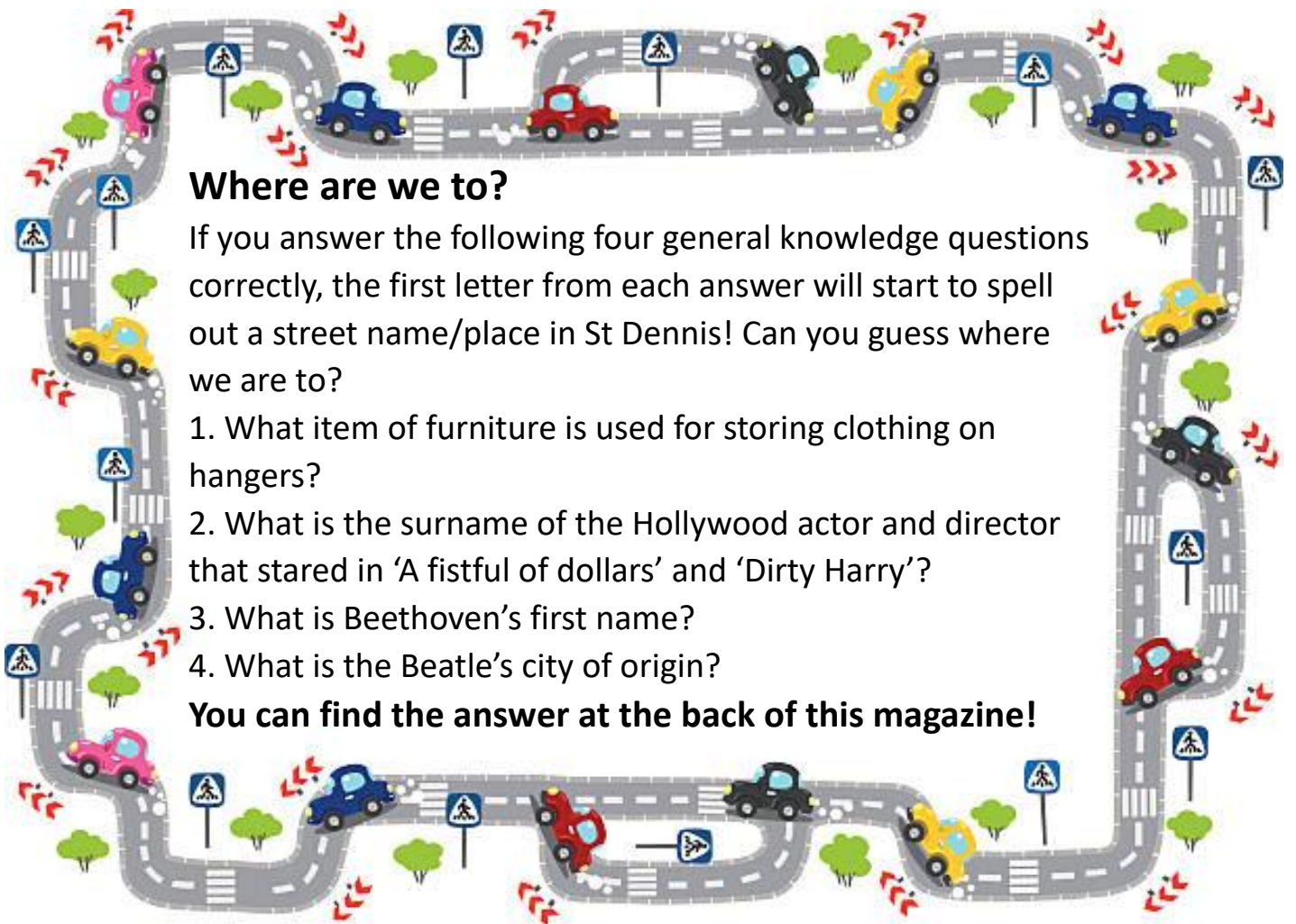

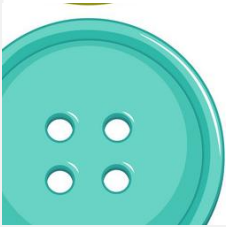

Meetings

In addition, throughout the year, committee meetings are held covering Planning, the Cemetery, Education Bursary, Playing Field Trust, General Purpose and Staffing. Annual Parish Meeting 2025

St Dennis Annual Parish Meeting was held on the 22nd of May. Thanks go to all those who attended and contributed to the meeting. It was a great opportunity to review the Parish Council's activities and achievements over the past 12 months and look ahead to future projects. A full report is available to view on our website. We were joined by PCSO Ally Relph who provided an informative police and crime report, and Peter Morse gave an update on developments at Cornish Lithium.

Good Citizen Award 2024

Cllr Julia Clarke had the pleasure of announcing the winners of the Good Citizen Award 2024 at the Annual Parish Meeting. Congratulations go to joint winners Liz and Steve Bradbury, awarded for their many contributions to projects within the Parish. The Bradbury's were unable to attend the meeting as they were abroad but did provide the following words of acceptance *'We both feel very humbled to have been nominated for the Good Citizen Award. When we moved to the village nearly 8 years ago, getting involved with groups and events was a wonderful way to meet people and make new friends. We have been so lucky as St Dennis is such a welcoming village with plenty going on. We have both come from backgrounds and families where 'getting stuck in' was the norm; so on moving here and being semi-retired we have had the luxury of time to pursue new hobbies and passions. Everything we have become involved with has been a complete team effort of so many people. The Bells Restoration project, for example, has involved dozens of people from St Dennis and further afield, all wanting to achieve something special. The fun and friendship we get from being involved is, itself, enough reward – we truly get much more from everything than we put in.*

Beating of the Bounds

Our Parish Clerk, Lynn Clarke attended the Beating of the Bounds on Saturday 7th of June. Beating of the Bounds is a traditional ceremony where the boundaries of the Parish are walked and marked. It's a way to reaffirm boundaries, share knowledge and pray for protection of the land. Here's an account from Lynn about the day *'I was delighted to be invited by Adrian Wilson of St Deny's Branch of the Old Cornwall Society to take part in the first ever re-enactment of the ancient tradition "Beating of the Bounds" held in St Dennis by the Society. This traditional ceremony saw us visit four key boundary points—north, south, east, and west—where readings were shared in both Cornish and English, celebrating our heritage and connection to the land. Despite the grey skies, spirits were high as I joined Cllr Edmunds and three other members of The Old Cornwall Society for this meaningful trip around the Parish of St Dennis. It was a fantastic opportunity to honour local tradition and community, and I'm already looking forward to the next one.'*

The weather was a little unkind given the beautiful sunshine the day before, but this didn't dampen anyone's spirits. Multiple bags of rubbish and discarded items were collected including not one but two tyres! After a couple of hours of litter picking all were welcomed back to ClayTAWC to enjoy a hot drink, cake, biscuits and a well-deserved pasty. All participants were presented with a certificate for their contribution and the youngest member of the team also received a goody bag of treats. Vandalism & Anti-Social Behaviour

We're saddened and frustrated to report a series of incidents of damage and vandalism that continue to occur in the Parish, mostly focused on the Playing Field. These have ranged from a stolen memorial plaque, damaged grit bin, destroyed sign, damage to bank repairs, damage to fence panels, broken bird and bug boxes, damaged goal post and abuse of stored property. These senseless acts of deliberate damage means public funds will have to be spent to put things right. This behaviour is unacceptable and being taken extremely seriously. All incidents have been reported to the police, and CCTV footage has been reviewed to assist with the investigations.

If you have any information or witness any acts of vandalism or anti-social behaviour, please contact the Parish Council or report directly to the police.

St Denys & District Old Cornwall Society

On June 7th members of St. Denys & District Old Cornwall Society enacted a trial run of the “Beating of The Bounds” ceremony. We were joined by Parish Clerk, Lynn Jacobs, but unfortunately Councillor Dick Cole was unable to attend due to commitments at Royal Cornwall on the same day. The Beating of The Bounds ceremony is an ancient tradition going back many centuries where before modern maps people of the parish visited the parish boundaries to ensure that a neighbouring parish or unscrupulous landowner had not moved the boundary to their advantage, we visited 4 boundary points near Tregoss, Crown Mine, Higher Bodella and Gaverigan and got quite wet! A short speech in Kernewek and Sowsnek (Cornish and English) was spoken at each point warning anyone against moving the boundary! This was a trial run, we hope to expand it next year and invite villagers to attend.

GOVERNMENT MINISTER VISITS CORNISH LITHIUM

Cornish Lithium recently welcomed Minister of State at the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero, Sarah Jones MP, to our Trelavour Lithium Project. During her visit, Minister Jones met with staff members including the Founder and Executive Chairman Jeremy Wrathall and CEO Jamie Airnes.

Together they discussed Cornish Lithium's key role in helping to secure a supply of lithium in the UK, and how strong collaboration between government and industry is more vital than ever. The visit was an opportunity to showcase our state-of-the-art processing plant, share our vision for responsible lithium production, and introduce the people behind our work.



CORNISH LITHIUM ACQUIRES NEW TECHNOLOGY AND PATENTS TO STRENGTHEN END-TO-END LITHIUM PRODUCTION READINESS

Cornish Lithium is pleased to announce the purchase of cutting-edge technology developed by Australian group Lepidico. The move gives the company the ability to mine, process and refine battery-grade lithium hydroxide within its site at Trelavour Downs in Cornwall. This end-to-end "pit to battery-grade product" capability helps to de-risk extraction, refining and processing as the business moves at pace from research and development to full-scale UK lithium

The new technology, incorporated into the company's recently commissioned, state-of-the-art demonstration plant in Cornwall, operates at atmospheric pressure and at moderate temperature, significantly reducing carbon emissions and helping to set a new sustainability standard in the sector.

Bring along your children or grandchildren with their decorated bucket & spade and win prizes for the best ones. 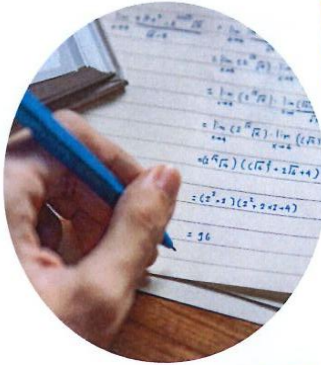

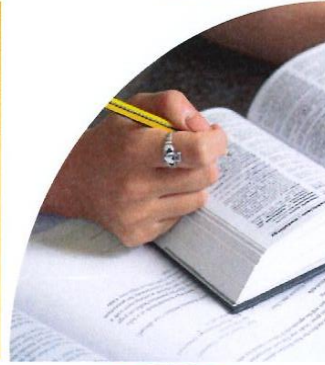

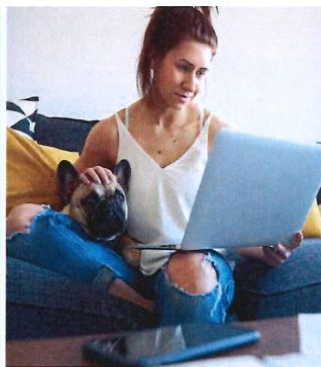
