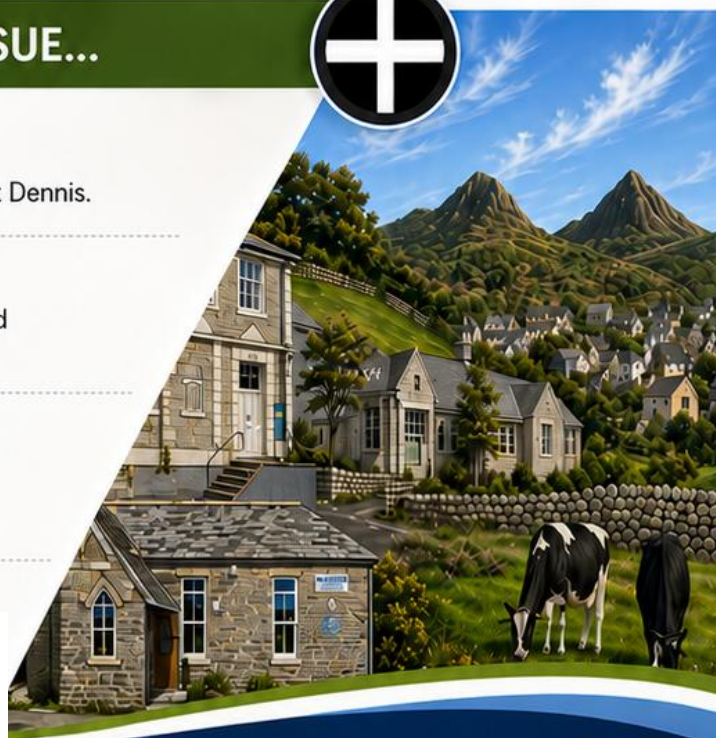

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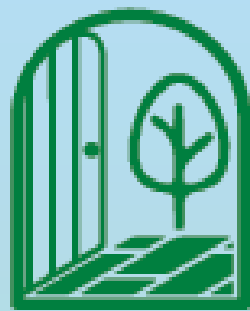
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Celebrating the St Dennis Ukulele Band

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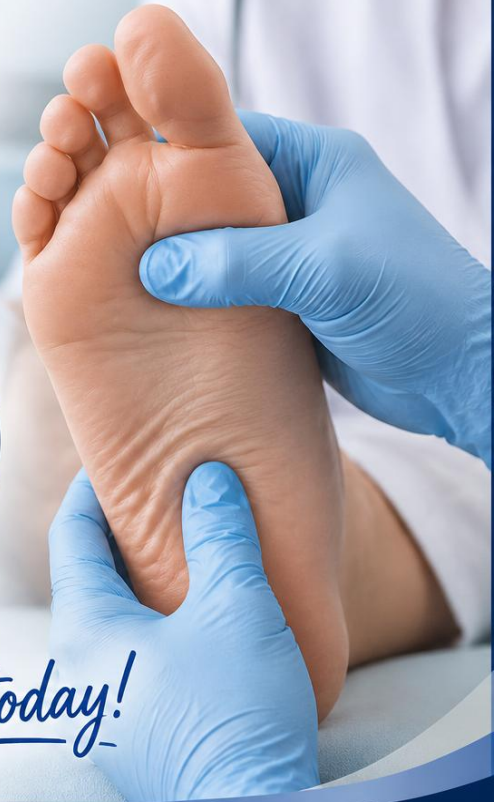

Update on Trerice Solar Farm

The proposal for a 32MW solar farm at Trerice was given the go-ahead on the 12th of August by a government planning Inspector. The original application was recommended for approval by planning officers at Cornwall Council, but was turned down by Councillors at a meeting of the Strategic Planning Committee on 10th July 2025. The applicants went to appeal, and a hearing was held at the Pitch on 12th May. The planning inspector has published her ruling. She acknowledges that the solar array will have a "significant adverse impact on the local landscape," as well as "limited harm as a result of the long-term loss of best and most versatile land, and harm at the lower end of 'less than substantial' harm to the setting of two designated heritage assets."

But she also gave significant weight to the "national benefits associated with renewable or low carbon energy" and, in her conclusion, took the view that the "totality of benefits of the proposal outweighed the harms."

The applicants also lodged an application for an award of costs. This was refused. The planning inspector noted the following:

"Local residents and Councillors raised pertinent matters in respect of character and appearance and heritage, amongst other things. Even though my final decision was to allow the development, it was not, in my view, a case which could be described as one which should clearly have been permitted, as the various matters raised needed to be weighed in the planning balance. Members are, in any event, entitled to disagree with officer's recommendations, and in this case they did so on reasonable grounds and engaged proactively throughout the appeal process."

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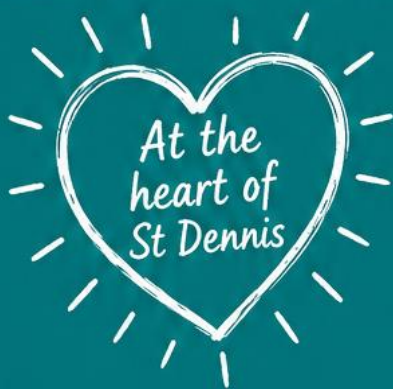

There's a particular light that falls over the clay country in September — low, gold, catching the last of the swallows before they go. Harvest here has always meant more than fields. It's the sky tips turning amber at dusk, the smell of bonfires starting up again, children kicking through the first fallen leaves on the way to the village school. Its neighbours swapping surplus apples over the fence, and preparations for harvest suppers, homemade chutneys, the same harvest songs sung on your behalf at church each year. Whatever else changes, this rhythm holds: a community pausing to notice what the land has given, and what it costs to bring it in. Enjoy the last of the golden days.

SOME UPDATES FROM CLLR DICK COLE

CORNWALL COUNCILLOR FOR ST DENNIS AND ST ENODER

PLANNING APPEAL FOR TRERICE SOLAR FARM

The main local news, this month, is that the proposal for a 32MW solar farm at Trerice has been given the go-ahead by a government planning inspector.

The original application was recommended for approval by planning officers at Cornwall Council, but was turned down by councillors at a meeting of the Strategic Planning Committee on 10th July 2025. In the committee report, the planning officer had accepted the perspective of the applicants that the landscape harm caused by the solar arrays would be “moderate to slight adverse” and “would not be significant.”

But we argued that the adverse impact on landscape was indeed significant and the reason for refusal stated: “The proposed development, by reason of installing this renewable energy scheme onto these undeveloped fields in a countryside location alongside other existing industrial development, such as the nearby waste to energy plant and mining operations, would result in significant harm to the distinctive character of the site and the wider surrounding area.”

The applicants went to appeal and a hearing was held at the Pitch on 12th May. As I have previously reported, I attended the planning hearing with the Chair of the Parish Council, Julia Clarke. I had prepared a 4,000-word representation and this formed the basis of the representations we made at the meeting, which included concerns about landscape harm, the cumulative impact on a community that has already accommodated very substantial industrialisation, as well as heritage matters.

The planning inspector published her ruling on 11th August. I feel vindicated that she agreed with local councillors that the solar farm would have a “significant adverse impact on the local landscape.” She also acknowledged that there would be “limited harm as a result of the long-term loss of best and most versatile land, and harm at the lower end of ‘less than substantial’ harm to the setting of two designated heritage assets.”

But she also gave significant weight to the “national benefits associated with renewable or low carbon energy” and, in her conclusion, took the view that these benefits “outweighed the harms.”

The applicants also lodged an application for an award of costs, claiming that Cornwall Council had acted unreasonably in refusing planning permission, causing them to incur unnecessary or wasted expense in the appeal process. In their submission, they argued: “This is not a scheme which should be at appeal. Instead, this is a much needed development, and there were and are no reasonable grounds upon which to refuse permission.”

This claim for costs was rightly rejected. The planning inspector noted the following: “Local residents and councillors raised pertinent matters in respect of character and appearance and heritage, amongst other things. Even though my final decision was to allow the development, it was not, in my view, a case which could be described as one which should clearly have been permitted, as the various

matters raised needed to be weighed in the planning balance. Members are, in any event, entitled to disagree with officer's recommendations, and in this case they did so on reasonable grounds and engaged proactively throughout the appeal process."

HIGHWAY WORKS

Local residents will be aware that I have been pressuring council officers for a significant period of time about the poor condition of Carne Hill, Fore Street and Trelavour Road. At the time of writing this report, I am very pleased that the resurfacing of these roads is underway and a very good job is being done.

In addition to this, I have been making representations about the condition of the roadway around Domellick Bridge. I asked whether works could be done on this stretch of road at the same time as Carne Hill, etc, but that has not proved possible. But I am pleased to be able to report that works around the bridge will be carried out in October.

CORNISH LITHIUM

I continue to attend meetings of the Trelavour Community Liaison Group in advance of Cornish Lithium's submission of their Development Consent Order (DCO) application to the Planning Inspectorate. The company had been working towards an application date of late August or September, but recently confirmed that they are now aiming for November 2026.

The last meeting of the Liaison Group was useful in understanding how local people can engage with the main elements of the DCO process. It looks like individuals and local groups will need to register as "interested parties" to fully participate. In the coming weeks, I will ensure that everyone is aware of what they need to do register if they so wish.
